Resumé: Andy Best Researcher, Media Artist, Sculptor

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Andy Best was born in 1963 in the south of England. He moved to Finland in 1988, and has been creating art and media projects with his wife Merja Puustinen since 1993. Andy and Merja both have backgrounds in sculpture, video and installation art. They were amongst the first artists working online, and during the mid to late 1990's created beautiful, but provocative, multiuser 3D worlds on the internet. Their company Meetfactory has developed a web-based 3D multiuser community platform as well as virtual pet and e-learning applications for mobile phones. They focus on developing playful, physically engaging installations, robotic, and interactive works using physical computing techniques. They have recently founded Espoo Kunsthalle, an initiative to bring critically engaged art to the suburban areas of Espoo. Andy Best has presented works and papers at many international conferences and festivals of new media, art, and technology. Andy is an experienced curator, producer and educator and is currently lecturer in sculpture and a PhD student and researcher at Aalto University School of Arts, Design and Architecture.
