

Marja Rosti – Visual Artist and Image Builder

Marja Rosti is a Finnish visual artist best known for her photo-based works and collage techniques. Her artistic practice is rooted in subjective interpretations of societal phenomena, nature, objects, and people.

Artistic Style and Techniques

- Rosti defines herself as an image builder who uses photography as a means of expression.
- She utilizes digitally edited photographs, old image archives, and pigment transfer techniques.
- She also employs glue emulsion techniques, where laser print pigments are transferred onto transparent film and applied to various surfaces such as metal, glass, or fabric.
- Her creative process is based on playfulness and imaginative freedom—photography serves as the starting point from which the artwork begins to take shape.

Education and Background

- Trained as a visual arts teacher at the University of Art and Design Helsinki (now Aalto University).
- Studied graphic design at the Vantaa Institute of Design (now Metropolia University of Applied Sciences).
- Worked as an art educator for 45 years before transitioning to a full-time artist.
